From the Principal

I have had the pleasure of being the Relieving Principal this week while Mrs Maitland takes a well-earned week of Long Service Leave. As usual, any stay at Balcatta SHS has been enjoyable, rewarding and educational. The best part of the day can be spent looking out from the Principal's office as it overlooks the basketball and tennis courts. The courts are full before and after school, at recess and lunch times. It is wonderful to see students enjoying exercising and having fun without even realising that this is what they are doing.

Quite a lot of my time this week has been taken up monitoring the ever-changing landscape that is our daily life in these times of COVID-19. Thank you to our school community for doing your best to keep up with COVID-19-centred regulations as they apply to high schools. As of today, the three outstanding rules for students are:

- If there is a positive COVID case in the family, students are required to isolate for 7 days. If there are no symptoms and a negative test after 7 days, the student can stop isolating and return to school.
- If the student is a 'close contact' of a positive case **at school**, they will be required to take a RAT. If the test is negative and the student displays no symptoms, they can return to school but still need to isolate for 7 days from the community.
- If a student tests positive to a RAT, they are required to isolate for 7 days. If after 7 days, the RAT is negative, they may return to school.

It was very pleasing to see the return of our Swimming Carnivals. So far we have been fortunate with the weather. The Year 8 students held their carnival in the newly refurbished pool on Tuesday 8 March and Years 10-12 swimming carnival was held on Friday 11 March. National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA)

Friday 18 March 2022 is the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA). Australia's key bullying prevention initiative celebrates 12 years of action, connecting schools and communities to find workable solutions to prevent bullying.

The theme for 2022 is *Kindness Culture*. By building *Kindness Culture* together, we can promote inclusion, respect and community belonging for all students in schools across Australia.

Harmony Day

On Wednesday 23 March, students will be celebrating Harmony Day. Students are encouraged to wear something orange or dress up representing their culture to show their support for cultural diversity and an inclusive Australia.

Learning Area News

Drama

Drama has become very physical this week with students beginning to learn how to twirl poi (weighted socks) and LED light rods/staffs. Drama students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have all been experimenting with these new 'toys' and students are already able to perform tricks and techniques that look very impressive. These skills will become part of their Clown and Circus performances next term and there are some sore arms and muscles this week as twirling for an hour can be hard work. Twirling LED light rods/staff in the darkened Performing Arts Theatre is a really exciting activity and makes us all feel like we are professionals in a Cirque.

Year 9 AEP Science

As part of the Year 9 Chemical Sciences curriculum this term, students are learning about elements in the Periodic Table and looking into their properties and characteristics. One of the elements that we focused on was hydrogen. To investigate the properties of hydrogen the Year 9 Science students from Mrs Dewi's Academic Extension class did a practical demonstration where balloons were filled up with hydrogen gas and due to it being a light gas, the balloons floated. Hydrogen is a very flammable gas which reacts with oxygen in air when lit and burns with a popping sound as it produces water as a product.
