From the Principal

We have reached the final week of the 2022 school year. What a year it has been. As I look back, I would like to share some reflections with you.

- We started the year with our "official opening event". Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the event was small and the number of guests were limited.
- The Balcatta SHS redevelopment project was awarded the "Hillson Beasley Award for Education Architecture" (nominated by the architects, Hassell). This is the highest award in the Education Projects category.
- The year commenced with the largest Year 7 cohort, starting with seven classes of MESH and other subjects and a full class for the Gifted and Talented Visual Art Program.
- Year 7 students commenced Week 1 with transition activities and an off-site recreational day at Ern Halliday Recreation Centre.
- The return of swimming carnivals in our newly refurbished pool.
- Students participated and represented the school in various sporting events.
- Continued promotion of Act-Belong-Commit through various whole school activities/events including Harmony Day, National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence, NAIDOC celebrations, Wear it Purple Day, R U OK? Day and National Reconciliation Week.
- Continued growth of our Education Support Program including a Work Skills Preparation course.
- Students participated in external academic competitions such as the Big Science Competition and Maths Fest.
- Numerous excursions and incursions across all Learning Areas.
- The appointment of a Careers Practitioner (one of 70 schools to be allocated this resource). Nicole Anderson is developing a whole school plan for Careers Education including the launch of the Balcatta SHS <u>Careers website</u>.
- The growth of Try-A-Trade opportunities for Year 9 and Year 10 students across a range of industries.
- 40th Anniversary of the Approved Specialist Dance Program.
- The growth of our House System with the launch of the "Principal's Award".
- Inaugural Team Connect Cricket for girls.
- Artwork from our Gifted and Talented Visual Art students was selected for various exhibitions.
- Dance and Music students performed at various events throughout the year showcasing their talents.
- Unique curriculum opportunities for our students such as Aston Villa Football Club training clinic, Formula 1 for girls Inspire event, University of WA Space Camp, Virtual Reality learning plus many more.
- Student leadership opportunities including our student representatives visited Parliament House. Also, students assisting as umpires at sporting events, planning whole school events, transition activities, showing visitors around the school,
