From the Principal

The last couple of weeks have been very busy. This week, we celebrated Harmony Day. It was very pleasing to see a large number of students dressing up representing their culture, and staff and students wearing orange which is the colour that signifies Harmony Day. We are a very diverse community with staff and students from over 40 different nationalities.

As a school community, we acknowledged inclusiveness, respect and belonging. Throughout the day, students were involved in a range of classroom-based activities acknowledging Harmony Day and during recess and lunch breaks, students were able to participate in various activities including:

Students distributed Harmony Day school pens and respect/honour cards for students to complete and hand over to another student as a way of celebrating and honouring them for 'who they are'. A sincere thank you to the Student Services team as well as staff and students for their contribution.

Parking Reminder

Over the last few months, there has been information provided to the school community regarding issues on parking on Amelia Street. Recently, I was taken aback with feedback I received from the City of Stirling Rangers. They stated that some parents told them the school allowed them to park in Amelia Street. This is not true. I wish to confirm and remind parents again, parking is not allowed in the designated cycle lanes on both sides of Amelia Street. Refer to the Balcatta Update dated 3 February 2022 under Amelia Street Parking Concerns.

Yesterday, the City of Stirling Rangers were at the school on Amelia Street at the end of the school day reminding parents again the cycle lanes are not a parking area. The City of Stirling may enforce Infringement Notices. It was very disappointing to hear and witness some parent behaviour, such as blaming the school about parking and rudeness towards the Rangers. I am seeking your support, once again, please do not pick up or drop off students on Amelia Street (in the designated cycle lanes). The completion of the new pick up and drop off area should be available at the start of Term 2 (details to be confirmed soon).

Interim Reporting - Thursday 31 March

Students' Interim Reports will be emailed to families by Wednesday 30 March. We are not able to have person-to-

person interviews due to COVID-19 restrictions. Staff will be contacting selected parents via email on Thursday 31 March. If you do not receive any contact on this date and would like feedback on your child from a staff member, please feel free to contact the teacher directly via email. COVID-19 Reminder to Parents

Thank you to everyone who is doing their best to keep up with COVID-19 regulations. Currently we are dealing with a number of close contacts and positive cases and we are following the Department of Health guidelines. For the safety and well-being of our whole school community, it is essential you notify the school if your child is COVID-19 positive or is a close contact to a positive case.

A reminder of the guidelines for schools is as follows:

- If there is a positive COVID case in the family, students are required to isolate for 7 days. If there are no symptoms and a negative test after 7 days, the student can stop isolating and return to school.
- If the student is a 'close contact' of a positive case at school, they will be required to take a RAT. If the test is negative and the student displays no symptoms, they can return to school but still need to isolate for 7 days from the community.
- If a student tests positive to a RAT, they are required to isolate for 7 days. If after 7 days, the RAT is negative, they may return to school.
