# From the Principal

It has been a very busy term with the Year 7 and Year 9 students undertaking NAPLAN testing. The school will receive the students' results towards the end of Term 3, at which time they will be sent home.

The Year 12 General students completed their Externally Set Tasks with the results contributing to their final grade. The Year 11 and Year 12 ATAR students have completed their Semester 1 exams and will receive feedback on their performance when they return to their normal timetable.

The Year 8 and Year 9 students had learning area talks regarding choosing their electives for 2023. Students are required to complete their relevant 2023 Course Selection form, numbering their preferences from 1 to 10. For Gifted and Talented Visual Art and Specialist Dance students, they are reminded to select the relevant course as their Number 1 choice. The forms are to be signed by the parent/carer and returned to the Admin office by **Friday 10 June**.

Year 10 students have commenced the course selection process for Year 11 in 2023 which has included course talks from each of the learning areas and the Career Practitioner. Parents were invited to attend a Year 11 in 2023 Information event held on Tuesday 24 May. Key information presented included:

- WACE requirements
- Presentation from each of the learning areas
- Course selection process

Students should have received their personalised Course Selection form which they are to bring to their Course Counselling interview. Interviews (approximately 25 minutes) are being held from Tuesday 19 July to Friday 5 August. More details regarding how to make an appointment will be sent during Week 9.

## **National Reconciliation Week**

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates for National Reconciliation Week remain the same each year – 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey:

- 27 May in 1967, 90% of Australians voted 'YES' in a referendum, giving the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and count them in the census.
- 3 June in 1992, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people's special relationship with the land. This paved the way for land rights and Native Title.

The National Reconciliation Week 2022 theme, "Be Brave.

Make Change" is a challenge to all Australians – individuals, families, communities, organisations and government – to Be Brave and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation so we can Make Change for the benefit of all Australians.

Thank you to Akeisha Reid (Year 11) and Matthew Davies (Year 12) who addressed the whole school about National Reconciliation Week 2022.

### **Student Mobile Phone Reminder**

As you are aware, the State Government implemented a Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy. The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones, smart watches, earbuds, tablets and head phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. The policy is 'off and away all day'. Exceptions are allowed for students who have approval from the Principal to use a phone to monitor health conditions or when a teacher gives students permission to use mobile phones for a specific curriculum purpose. If a student needs to contact a parent/carer, they can ask at Student Services. Parents must always communicate through the school on 9345 8200 if they need to make emergency contact with their child/ren.

# **Learning Area News**

#### Year 7 Science

In Term 2, Year 7 students are studying the Physical Sciences, beginning with a focus on contact and non-contact forces. Non-contact forces such as magnetic force, electrostatic force and gravitational force are able to affect objects without touching them. Later in the term Year 7s will learn about simple machines such as levers, pulleys and inclined planes.

## **Education Support Program**

The Education Support students have been building Vege Pod garden beds. They problem-solved an issue where a part was broken. The replaced and fitted the part themselves. This has been an excellent life-skills journey so far. A compost tumbler and worms were also purchased using funding from the P&C. It is being used for our food waste. Students are in the process of learning how to correctly care for compost and will roll out a program to collect food waste from other places around the school such as from Home Economics.

## Year 7 HaSS Incursion

On Wednesday 1 June 2022, the Water Corporation visited the school to present The Waterwise Experience, an interactive, multi-sensory incursion for high school students. The incursion focused on maintaining Perth's water supply into the future. Students were taught how our water supply has changed over time, the process of desalination and how we can 'future-proof' its water for future generations. The incursion assisted students in completing their research task for the term in which they are required to compare water scarcity between Perth and a location in either Northern Africa or Western Asia.
