#### **NAPLAN**

Every year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. All Year 7 and Year 9 students will be provided with a detailed NAPLAN schedule. Spare copies for students will be available at Student Services.

## **ANZAC Commemoration**

On Friday 29 April, an ANZAC Commemoration was held in a virtual format during Period 2 class. ## **Premier's Reading Challenge**

On Thursday 5 May, the Premier Mark McGowan and Education Minister Sue Ellery have launched the Premier's Reading Challenge. The challenge will run from Thursday 5 May to Friday 9 September 2022 and is open to all students from Kindergarten to Year 10. Students participating in the challenge must read at least 12 books over the five-month period to be in the running to win major prizes. Prizes include a family holiday for the winner in each of the four-year group categories, and are available for students who read the most books, as well as those who have shown a significant improvement in their reading habits. Weekly prizes are also on offer. Students can go in the draw by logging a book per week.

This year's theme is 'Reading can take you anywhere', showcasing to students that a love of reading can open the door to a world of opportunities. Books can be read across all formats, including audiobooks, Braille and books in any language, and in all genres, including comics and graphic novels.

Additional support will be available for teachers so they can give their students any extra help they may need with phonics early in their schooling.

# **Learning Area News**

#### Years 7 to 10 Big Science Competition

During Weeks 2 and 3, the Years 7 to 10 Academic Extension Science classes will be taking part in the "Big Science Competition" which is a 50 minute, multiple choice competition testing science knowledge, critical-thinking and problem-solving skills. Questions are set in real-life, contemporary contexts, making them relatable (and interesting).

The Big Science Competition is an easy way to challenge students and track their performance against the state or

nationally. Competition questions are aligned with the Australian Curriculum for Science.

Students will receive a certificate indicating their performance. The Big Science Competition could lead to selection in Science extension programs including the <u>Australian Science Olympiads</u> and <u>Curious Minds – Girls in STEM.</u>

## Year 11 Psychology ATAR students

The Year 11 Psychology ATAR students have been studying cognitive processes, such as sensation and perception. They have looked at sensory organs and stimuli as well as illusions and distortions of visual perception. This included a cow's eye dissection to investigate the physical anatomy of the eye.

## **Careers Information**

In the lead up to National Careers Week (16-22 May 2022), we launched our own <u>Careers website</u>. It is a live website that contains the latest information for post-schooling options, a live calendar with open days, information to assist parents and students in the lead up to subject selections and much, much more. ## Young Leaders Council at University of WA

During the Term 1 holidays a number of Year 12 students attended the Young Leaders Council at UWA. Students met with other students from different schools around Perth such as Perth Modern, Aquinas College, All Saints' College and more. This day in particular focused around the idea of inclusivity and accessibility, teaching student leaders different methods for school improvement. More specifically, there was a discussion about ethno-culture and how to make events and schools more accessible for people with disabilities. Those who attended the full day said they had lots of fun getting to know other students from different schools and learning how each school had a different way of running the student council. The Young Leader Council was an enjoyable and valuable experience for the students involved as they now have created a network for themselves with the other students.
