Learning Area News

Basketball Competition

On Tuesday 29 March, Balcatta SHS was involved in the School Sport WA Secondary Champion Schools Basketball Competition held at Bendat Basketball Centre in Floreat. This event was organised by Health & Physical Education teacher, Mr Liam Robinson.

Balcatta sent three teams to the competition; one Year 12 team and two Year 11 Teams consisting of more than 25 students. The Balcatta teams played four games each against a variety of teams over the day. All teams won at least one game and the Year 11A Division team made it through the Round Robin games before being knocked out in the semi-finals.

We also had nine Year 9 students come along to help umpire, score and coach the Upper School teams throughout the day.

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Their assistance ensured the smooth running of the day and was very much appreciated.

All teams played with great sportsmanship and Mr Robinson was very proud of the way they represented their school and themselves. Well done students!

Education Support

Our Years 10-12 students are preparing for work placements by completing the Work Skills Preparation Course.

This program is based on a range of skills required across a number of disability employment providers such as Activ Foundation, Workpower and Good Samaritan Industries where they require goods to be counted, bundled, sorted, measured, packaged and organised.

The classroom is treated just like a workplace where students are required to wear PPE, practise good hygiene and follow safety regulations. They must accurately follow instructions, work independently or as part of a team by communicating

effectively, as well as applying problem-solving strategies when they find something challenging. They are building resilience and the Education Support team is impressed with their capabilities already.

Year 11 Health Studies

During Week 9, guest speakers from PBF (Paraplegic Benefit Fund) held a presentation to three Year 11 Health Studies classes. They discussed their personal stories of how they damaged their spinal cords from different forms of road trauma. The idea of these presentations was to remind our students about taking care when using the roads and not to be afraid to speak up when they are in a situation which makes them feel unsafe when driving with others. It also highlighted the "Fatal 5" that every driver needs to consider. They are **seatbelts**, **fatigue**, **speed**, **drugs & alcohol and distractions**. All students were thoroughly engaged and were left pondering what kind of driver they will be in the future.
